British Values At Crowmoor Primary School and Nursery

Pupils are expected to learn the Following Basic British Values:

- an understanding of how citizens can influence decision-making through the democratic process
- an understanding that the freedom to hold other faiths and beliefs is protected in law
- an acceptance that people having different faiths or beliefs to oneself (or having none) should be accepted and tolerated, and should not be the cause of prejudicial or discriminatory behavior
- an understanding of the importance of identifying and combatting discrimination

In addition to these fundamental beliefs the whole school community also participated in a consultation on which additional values they felt were fundamentally British and those chosen were:

Trust and honesty

Patience

Empathy and appreciation

Courage

Peace and freedom

As a School we are committed to upholding the United Nations Convention on The Rights of the Child and we are working towards accreditation as a UNICEF Right's Respecting School .All of the above values and reinforced and imbedded by the Convention.

Children are taught the values through a mixture of specific planned activities such as voting by Secret ballot for the School's Council members; through work they complete in Religious education and Personal and Social Education and throughout the curriculum as an integral part of the pastoral and academic curriculum the School delivers.

Our prevent duty:

At Crowmoor Primary School we recognise that extremism and exposure to extremist materials and influences can lead to poor outcomes for pupils and so should be addressed as a safeguarding concern as set out in our CP policy. We also recognise that if we fail to challenge extremist views, we are failing to protect our pupils.
