When you are reading explore the new vocabulary you find. Can you find out the origin (where it came from) of the word? Can the word be modified by adding a suffix or prefix? Select 10 spellings to learn each week. <p>Use the look, say, cover, write and check method to learn them.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 2. Use a dictionary to find out the meaning of any words that you are unsure of. Perhaps you could write your own definition. 3. Practise spelling them using a different colour to your pencil for the vowels. Write the word and every vowel complete in the colour, for example, spelling. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Please continue to keep a daily diary. What writing techniques can you include? 2. Write a letter to the Prime Minister persuading him to donate more money to tackle global food shortages. 3. Thank a community hero. Think of someone that helps you in some way and write a short letter to thank them. 4. Write a review of the last film you watched. Do not spend more than one quarter of the review retelling the plot: your review should focus on your opinion about the film. 	<p>In your letters and film review make sure you use the Year 3 grammar and punctuation that we have been learning about. Maths- Survey your family for the reasons behind global food shortages and record their responses in a bar chart, pictogram, etc. 	<p>1. Create a restaurant menu based on the traditions of a chosen country. Remember to add diagrams and prices to your menu.</p> <p>2. Star in your own information video or create a poster to promote hygiene and safety in the kitchen. Don't forget to think about who your audience is.</p> <p>3. Evaluate a range of food packaging. What are the similarities and differences? Do you think the packaging is effective? Explain your answer.</p> <p>Science- Plants</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 4. Get out into your garden and help with the gardening. Maybe pull up some weeds or help mow the lawn. Could you help tidy up your garden. Maybe you could plant some seeds or water the flowers or plants. The Kids Garden website has lots of ideas for involving children in gardening, using their knowledge of plants. 5. 





Roll and Draw Plant Game

To play this game you will need a 1 - 6 dice, a pencil and paper and a friend or family member to play with.

All plants are made up of different parts - roots, the stem, leaves and flowers.

The aim of this game is to draw a complete plant by rolling the dice.

You can draw a different part of your plant each time you roll a number:

- 1 = the roots
- 2 = the stem
- 3 = the leaves
- 4 = the petals
- 5 = the stamens
- 6 = the style and the stigma

If you roll a number you have already had, you should miss a turn.
