Select 10 spellings to learn each week. <p>Use the look, say, cover, write and check method to learn them.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 2. Use a dictionary to find out the meaning of any words that you are unsure of. Perhaps you could write your own definition. 3. Write a sentence using each word in context. 	<p>Please continue to keep a diary daily, you should include the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Date in full – Friday 15th May 2020. • Climate – mention the temperature, weather, wind speeds etc. • A news item of interest - watch Newsround or the daily news to help you. Newspapers are also a good way of keeping up to date on local current affairs. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Design an information leaflet that highlights how children can keep safe. Think about the key information you would need to include. How could you make your leaflet eye-catching to the reading? 2. Begin your very own cookery book full of your favourite things to eat? This can be very simple, for example, 'How to make a sandwich'. This could then be used to help with meal time ideas. 3. Create an 'Eye Spy with my Rainbow Eye' poem using <u>all</u> of the colours of the rainbow. Write about items you can see that are the same colour and remember to use lots of description. See below for an example 	<p>In your leaflet and poem make sure you use the Year 3 grammar and punctuation that we have been learning about. Fractions</p> <p>4. Time – Do you know the number of seconds in a minute and the number of days in each month, year and leap year?</p> <p>5. Go on 'Numbergym' – you should know your password – enter web address, click on online access tab and then add Crowmoor and maths4me then select your game and add your password.</p>	<p>1. What is a balanced diet? Find out about the main food groups (carbohydrates, protein, fruit and vegetables, dairy and fat). Draw a plate with a meal that would include all of those elements. https://www.nhs.uk/live-well/eat-well/the-eatwell-guide/ is a good website to use for your research.</p> <p>2. Can you sort foods from your house into the different groups?</p> <p>3. Where does your food come from? Which foods come from the UK? What is Fairtrade? Use https://schools.fairtrade.org.uk/resource/?type=homelearning#page-1 to help you find out more information. Create a leaflet about Fairtrade – your focus could be on chocolate.</p> <p>Science- Plants</p> <p>1. Find out about 'capillary action', which is important for moving water around, in plants.</p> <p>2. Cut a strip from a paper towel, draw lines one end using a felt tip pen. Put that end in water and observe what happens.</p>	<p>1 Complete an observational drawing of what you can see outside a window in your house. Then get out into the garden and find natural forms such as stones, leaves, flowers and animals. Complete sketches, showing an awareness of different viewpoints of the same object. Remember to concentrate on tone and shading.</p> <p>2 Move around your home and garden taking photographs from different viewpoints. Which photos do you like? Do the people you live with like the same photos as you? Why? Why not?</p> <p>3 When you are out on your walk or in the garden, find as many beautiful flowers that you are allowed to pick. Then place them in between 2 pieces of paper and 2 heavy books. Leave them for a few days and then take a look. 


