Can you write your own rhyming sentence to rhyme with your name? E.g. Miss Jones sits on phones! Miss Cave won't behave! Mr P hurt his knee! Can you make up any rhymes that rhyme with the different planets? Make them as silly as you like – you can even make up words, as long as they rhyme! ☺ If you were going to the moon, what would take with you? Can you write a list of things you would need to pack? If you met an alien on your adventure, what would you tell them about yourself? Can you write an 'All About Me' to tell them who you are and what you like? 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Use recyclable materials to make a vehicle to zoom to the moon on or zoom around the moon. What 3D shapes have you used? Why? See how far your vehicle can travel. How can you measure it? Make more than one and race them – which goes furthest? How do you know? Play a number bonds to five game on your hands – moving one digit from one hand to the other. If that's too easy ask a sibling or adult to play bonds to 10. 1. Look at pictures of different planets and compare them to earth – what's the same? What's different?
2. Can you see any plants or animals on any of the planets? Why do you think the plants and animals on our planet couldn't live on other planets? What do they need to survive?




3. We are starting to move into the Summer Season. What has changed outside in your garden or near your house? What is happening to the weather? If a tree looks like this in Summer, can you draw a picture of what happens in the next season? And the next? Show what happens over the year.

4. This term we would have been looking at the work of a renowned space-themed painter, Robert T McCall who created a number of pieces for NASA as well as many others.



Have a look at some of his work. Which one do you like best? Can you recreate one of his pieces or create your own space picture?

5. Look at the poem 'The Moon Game' on the next page. Can you recreate the different stages of the moon using a potato/sponge or whatever you would like to print with, in paint, mud or whatever you can find. ☺ Or draw what you think the moon might look like each night and ask an adult to check for you when it's dark. I wonder how many times you will be right.
6. Sing 5 little men in a flying saucer – make some puppets and a flying saucer to use while you sing the song.



7. Create your own shadow puppets and put on a show for your family.
