




Tasks for Key Stage 1: Chestnut and Elm Class - Mrs Dowell and Mrs Richards

Keep a diary of what you eat each day.</p> <p>2. Write about your favourite meal and why you like it.</p> <p>3. What is your least favourite meal? Why don't you like it?</p> <p>4. Write instructions for making a snack. Use some bossy verbs to start each command.</p> <p>Wash... Cut... Put,,, Slice...</p>	<p>1. In your writing, make sure you use capital letters and full stops in the correct place.</p> <p>2. Play a guessing game with a partner.</p> <p>Ask them to choose a secret fruit or vegetable.</p> <p>Now you ask questions to find out information:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Is it red? • Is it soft? • Do you peel it? <p>They can only answer yes or no!</p> <p>Make sure your sentence is a question.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Take it in turns.</p>

What are they called? Which is the biggest? What lives in them? How are they different? How can we look after them?</p> <p>Make a poster with drawings and labels to show to your family.</p> 	<p>Make an underwater scene using a box and other recycled materials from your home.</p> <p>Use sweet wrappers of crisp packets to make fish shapes and hang them from thread.</p> <p>Make underwater plants from cereal packets.</p> <p>How can you fold the card to make them stand up?</p>
