**Subject: Religious Education**



<b>Aspiration</b>	<p>Pupils at Crowmoor are encouraged to explore their personal aspirations by providing them with knowledge and understanding of a range of religions and worldviews, enabling them to develop their ideas, values and identity. They work together with their teachers and peers to learn about different faiths. All pupil's work and opinions are highly valued, and everyone is taught to respect one another's opinion and beliefs.</p>
<b>Healthy Lifestyle</b>	<p>Religious Education is a great way to express your own opinions and build relationships with your peers, by being able to explore and discuss your beliefs and opinions. Throughout RE, children are taught different ways that religions support communities such as foodbanks, charitable life styles and the importance reflection; these will support our children in knowing where they can seek support in their local area and different ways they can express their opinions and feelings through techniques discussed. In addition to this, our RE curriculum promotes spiritual, moral, social and cultural development through each unit of work, aiding with children's self-expression and helping them to discover a sense of self.</p>
<b>Communication</b>	<p>Religions Education develops an aptitude for dialogue in pupils so that they can participate positively in our society which is diverse in relation to religious and worldviews. Children learn to articulate clear and coherent accounts of their personal worldviews, beliefs, ideas, values, and experiences, while respecting the right of others to have different views values and ways of life.</p>
<b>Knowledge of the World</b>	<p>At Crowmoor we aim to provide a balanced, inclusive and inspiring approach to RE. This curriculum allows us to make a major contribution to pupil's awareness, appreciation and exploration of the British Values, religions and world views. This will enable children to build and develop their own view and identity and allow them to participate fully in our society. We want the children at Crowmoor to respect the views and rights of others and this is an integral part of the RE curriculum,</p>
