



Crowmoor Curriculum Intent - Modern Foreign Languages (French)

At Crowmoor School, our intention is for all KS2 children to have an appreciation for other cultures and a respect for differences and similarities between people across the world. Children who come from other countries (including refugees) who attend Crowmoor can offer valuable insights into other cultures, traditions, languages and religions, and we celebrate these.

All teachers are encouraged to include languages other than English into their daily routines. It is our intention that children speak, read and write basic conversational and topic-based French with confidence. For this reason, we focus on developing and consolidating a core vocabulary, aiming for good recall, accurate pronunciation and grammatical understanding.

Our scheme for French shows clear progression in the understanding of French language and cultural awareness through the school. This is taught through a mixture of:

- asking and answering questions;
- singing songs;
- reading stories and poems;
- memorising words;
- interpreting meanings;

The impact of our MFL curriculum is that children are able to demonstrate a good level of competence in speaking, reading and writing simple French words and sentences.

Children compare and take an interest in traditions, cultures, lifestyles, geography and language features other than their own.

Children have a good grounding from their language teaching at Crowmoor so that they can approach their language learning at Secondary school with a good level of understanding and confidence.
