This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

# Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

Crowmoor Primary School follows the online music scheme 'Charanga'. Lessons incorporate the following: learning and appraising, musical activities (creating and exploring), singing, playing instruments and performing. During these lessons, children learn to read musical notation, improvise and compose their own music. Our music curriculum is informed by the Model Music Curriculum and meets National Curriculum requirements.

Music is monitored regularly by our senior leadership team along with the school's music lead.

At Crowmoor Primary School, we ensure music lessons are inclusive and interactive; reasonable adjustments are made and learning is adapted through the use of resources, pictorial notation, flexible groupings and technology. Music lessons are taught by class teachers in every year group for one hour, weekly. Each class has a set of glockenspiels which are used in classes during most music lessons.

In Early Years, music is seen as a core component of children's learning. Lessons and learning opportunities are planned for so that children have the opportunity to listen, make music, sing and perform.

Development

- Music lead to monitor music lessons and provide support when needed.
- To continue to develop music lessons through pupil voice.

### Part B: Extra-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

Children are exposed to different opportunities to play, sing and perform.

Other musical opportunities children have outside of music lessons is during our wholeschool weekly singing assemblies as well as other community events.

Crowmoor Primary School has strong links with the Shrewsbury Baptist Church. We are fortunate to be able to use the church for different community music events throughout the academic year.
