

What is the Early Years Foundation Stage?

- The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) is the stage of education for children from birth to the end of the Reception year.
- It is based on the recognition that children learn best through play and active learning.

- Expressive, Arts & Design




Changes within EYFS

Mornings

 Lots of play based activities with free flow between indoor and outdoor learning.








- Daily Phonics sessions
- Mornings tend to be more formal with small group focus activities and independent learning.

Lunch






- All children in Reception entitled to Free School meals.
- Two choices always get what chosen as cooked to order.
- Menus given out at beginning of term.
- If your child brings a packed lunch please ensure it contains items they can open themselves or will involve as little contact as possible with the part they put in their mouth.



Afternoons are mostly child-led learning, free-flow indoor and out.



The first few weeks

We will find out what the children already know and can do and use this information to help us develop an individual learning programme for each child.

We spend lots of our time working and talking to the children about what they are learning. We may record some 'Wow' moments formally but largely we assess and move children on 'in the moment' and so not everything gets recorded.



You will be invited to discuss how your child has settled in and their progress so far at the parents evening.

Online learning journey - Tapestry

(Can be downloaded as an app on a smartphone or tablet or accessed via a browser.)

Once activated provides you with immediate online access to your child's learning.

New facilities all the time, documents, memos, activities etc. available through the browser rather than the app.

- · Take a photo of your child
- · Complete their 'About Me'
- Add observations to share things from home.



Things you can help your child to do before they start...

• Go to the toilet independently (no nappies) and wash their hands

• Practice 'catch it, bin it, kill it'



• Say goodbye to dummies! — (During the day at least!)



Things you can help your child to do before they start...


- Recognise their name
