WHAT IS PHONICS?

- Phonics is the idea that every word can be broken into individual sounds (phonemes), and each of those sounds can be represented by letters. It's one of the building blocks of the reading process.

## Children will learn:

- Over 40 sounds and matching letters
- To 'blend' sounds to read words

This is called decoding

All words are made up of sounds (phonemes)

- In English there are over 40!

## BLENDING...

- Most important pre-reading skill for children to learn.
- They can blend orally if children can understand words spoken in sound-talk.
- E.g. I can see a c-a-t /d-o-g / b-ir-d

OR put on your h-a-t / c-oa-t/b-oo-t-s

Blending is needed for reading

## BLENDING TO READ...

Sometimes using the sound cards to build the words can be easier for children to read initially until they become more confident. Saying each sound as you lay the card can be less daunting than seeing the whole word and can support them in seeing how the sounds go together to make that word.


TRICKY WORDS...
Some words your child won't be able to blend and segment - the, was, you, they etc

- These words cannot be decoded in the same way but we identify the tricky part of the word

- Stick to single syllable, 3 sounds for now, (4 when confident) back, head, tum, leg, foot, knee, toe, (hand) coat, hat, zip, sock, glove, (scarf) hop, tap, run, (clap, jump) shop, park, (school) red, blue, white, (green, black) knife, fork, bowl, pan, cup, ham, jam, cake, cheese, meat, soup
